Linn County 4-H/FFA 2024 Market Animal Information

Beef

- Can be either a heifer or steer, must be castrated before initial weigh-in
- Born between January 2023 and April 2023 are suggested birth dates
- Animal must have a rate of gain of 2 pounds per day or more from initial weigh-in to county fair weigh-in
- Weigh-in dates and times (Must attend one of these days)
 - February 7, 5-7PM @ Linn Co. Fair and Expo February 10, 9-11AM @ Lebanon FFA Land Lab
- Final fair weight requirements 1,000 lbs to 1,500 lbs and the 2lb rate of gain to sell in the auction.
 All steers must be in this weight range to sell. No exceptions.
- Recommended weight range at the initial weigh in is 700-1150 lbs for steers

Lambs

- Can be either ewe or wether, must be castrated before initial weigh-in
- Born between November 2023 and January 2024 are suggested birth dates (Lambs must have lamb's teeth to sell in the auction)
- Lamb must have a rate of gain of .25 pounds per day or more from inital weigh-in to county fair weigh-in
- Initial weigh-in weight requirement 120 lbs or less
- Weigh-in dates and times (must attend one)
 May 7, 5-8PM @ Linn County Fair and Expo
 May 8, 5-8PM @ Lebanon FFA Land Lab
- Final fair weigh requirements 110lbs to 160lbs and meet the .25lb rate of gain to sell in the auction. All lambs must be in this weight range to sell. No exceptions.
- Recommended weight range at the initial weigh in is 70-120 lbs for lambs.

Goats

- Can be either a doe or wether, must be castrated before initial weigh-in
- Born between November 2023 and January 2024 are suggested birth dates. (Goats must be less than a year old to sell in the auction)
- Goat must have a rate of .15 pounds per day or more from initial weigh in to county fair weigh-in
- Goat must have a Scrapie tag in place at initial weigh-in (this tag needs to come from the breeder of the goat)
- Initial weigh-in weigh requirement 80lbs or less
- Weigh-in dates and times (must attend one)
 May 7, 5-8PM @ Linn County Fair and Expo
 May 8, 5-8PM @ Lebanon FFA Land Lab
- Final fair weight requirements 60lbs to 110 lbs and meet the .15 lb rate of gain to sell in the auction. All goats must be in this weight range to sell. No exceptions.
- Recommended weight range at the initial weigh in is 50-80 lbs for goats

Hogs

- Can be a gilt or barrow, must be castrated before initial weigh-in
- Born between December 2023 and January 2024 are suggested birth dates
- Initial weigh-in weight requirements 185lbs or less
- Weigh-in dates and times (must attend one)
 May 7, 5-8PM @ Linn County Fair and Expo
 May 8, 5-8PM @ Lebanon FFA Land Lab
- Final fair weight requirements 220lbs to 300lbs.
 All hogs must be in this weight range to sell. No exceptions.
- Recommended weight range at the initial weigh in is 110-185 lbs for hogs.

Market Chickens (Pen of 3)

• Bird will be weighed individually at the fair and recorded by the Superintendent. Fast-growth and slow-growth breeds will compete together for an overall market chicken broiler/fryer champion, reserve champion, and subsequent placing of blue and red ribbon pens for auction order. Individual live weight requirements as noted in each class below.

Fast-Growth Broiler/Fryer

Includes Cornish Cross Strains

Weight: 6-9 pounds Recommended age: 6-8 weeks

Slow-Growth Broiler/Fryer

Includes Freedom Ranger, Red Ranger, Rainbow Ranger,
Ranger Classic and Ranger Gold breeds
Weight: 5-9 pounds
Recommended age: 9-11 weeks

Market Rabbits (Pen of 3)

Weight: 4-7 pounds

Age: less than 13 weeks

Once weighed in, rabbits will be placed in their respective classes (fryer or roaster).

Market Turkeys

- Hens and toms will compete together for an overall market turkey champion, reserve champion, and subsequent placing of blue and red ribbon pens for auction order.
- Market turkey should include the broad-breasted strains

Broad Breasted Tom:

Weight: 20-40 pounds

Age: recommended 18-20 weeks

Broad-Breasted Hen:

Weight: 15-20 pounds

Age: recommended 18-20 weeks

Heritage Tom

Weight: 20-40 pounds Age: less than 30 weeks

Heritage Hen

Weight: 15-40 pounds

Age: recommended 18-30 weeks

For all market animals, it is important to do your "homework" as a variety of factors contribute to each individual animal's final weight.
